Jacob's Well Report for 2019 Diocesan Assembly Submitted by Rev. Matthew Brown

As of 2019, Jacob's Well came under new leadership, ending the decades-long editorship of the V. Rev. John Shimchick. My team, and the entire Diocese, is grateful for his many excellent years of hard work. Jacob's Well is one of the world's longest-running Orthodox publications in English. Often, Orthodox periodicals are produced inconsistently, coming in and out of existence or taking a long hiatus. That Jacob's Well has been consistently published for so long testifies to Fr. John's dedication. Many Years!

Among the changes to Jacob's Well are not just a new Editor-in-Chief, but the addition of new staff members. I've chosen a team-based approach, tapping the talents of volunteer laymen and clergy in our Diocese. As a result, the quality and quantity of content, and its graphic design and layout have been significantly enhanced.

In an era of abundant and pervasive digital media, there remains a demand for the tactile experience of a well-printed, beautiful magazine. However, printing a magazine is costly while digital publications have relatively little overhead. Thus, Jacob's Well must justify itself by being more than a vehicle for content: It must be an experience.

To that end, we've paid close attention to the magazine's size, paper and printing quality, and its graphic design. As a result, our Diocese now offers her faithful something they can't find anywhere else: quality, edifying content pertaining to their Orthodox faith in an attractive physical format. Educating and inspiring our people, and reaching those outside our Tradition, is more effective when we stand out against the background noise of our saturated media culture.

I'd like to introduce our new staff members:

- Executive Editor Nick Tabor is a journalist at New York Magazine. Nick has been an essential factor in raising the quality of the content through recruitment of new and talented writers. Nick is a parishioner of the Holy Virgin Protection Cathedral, Manhattan.
- Art Director Tagor Vojnovic is responsible for Jacob Well's new look. Tagor is a freelance Graphic Designer and a parishioner of St John's, Alpha, NJ.
- Copy Editor Dn. David Maliniak (Christ the Saviour, Paramus, NJ) is now a Communications Specialist for an electronics manufacturer after many years as a journalist covering the electronics industry.
- Manager of Digital Publications V. Rev. Volodymyr Zablotsky oversees our website, social media presence, and digital subscriptions and publication. Fr. Volodymyr is Rector of Ss. Peter and Paul, Buffalo, NY.

New to Jacob's Well this year is a digital edition, providing wider access to the magazine not only for our parishioners, but also for Orthodox Christians beyond our diocese as well as non-Orthodox inquirers. Going digital lets Jacob's Well serve English-speaking Orthodox faithful worldwide. The digital format also facilitates sharing of content. Readers can post articles to their social media pages or share the digital version with family or friends. Should a parish run out of print copies, or when
