Dear Diocesan Clergy and Faithful:

Glory to Jesus Christ! Glory Forever!

It is with great joy that I greet all of you to announce the **Annual Girls Retreat!** The 3-day event will be held our newest venue, **Camp Shiloh located in Hewitt, NJ**, from **November 22-24, 2019**. The retreat is open to **young women in Middle School and High School** not only in our Diocese, but also to those in other jurisdictions and nearby dioceses. Please spread the word beyond your parishes! There is no fee in order to attend.

The theme of this year's retreat is "Come as you are: A friend loves at all times!" We will have a Pan-Orthodox panel of speakers, including myself, who will address the topic of friendship and the importance cultivating friendships not only in our parish communities, but also applying our Orthodox Christian behaviors in our day-to-day encounters with non-Orthodox friends. Panel members include Matushka Dennise Kraus, Lara Haluszczak, and Maria Pappas.

There is a **FIRM DEADLINE** for all registrants. Please submit forms online through the Department of Youth Ministry Website (http://nynjoca.wixsite.com/nynjocayouth/upcoming-events) **no later than November 8**th. I need to provide an initial headcount two weeks in advance.

A note concerning chaperones: We will need parents/youth leaders to accompany participants and act as chaperones while on-site. However, due to increased attendance at recent retreats and space limitations, at this point in time, we only need 4 chaperones. Priority is given to all youth who wish to attend and the minimum number of chaperones necessary to ensure that we have a safe weekend. The number of chaperones over our past few events has overwhelmed our participants, so this needs to be addressed in such a manner. If participants need to be driven to the event, I ask that parishes limit the number of adult chaperones staying the weekend to only 1 adult per parish. Please direct any concerns to myself and Fr. - 1. The number of chaperones for this retreat will be strictly aligned with the Diocesan Policy of having 1 chaperone for every 6 participants (ex: 25 participants, only 4 chaperones).
- 2. Chaperones will be selected on a first come, first served basis. Please only send 1 chaperone from your parish.
- 3. If any additional adults/clergy (non-chaperones) <u>arrive unannounced WITHOUT having registered with the intention of staying for the weekend OR only for a day, the venue WILL NOT allow this</u> the Diocese must pay for all expenses upfront prior to the event.

We built a wonderful partnership with Camp Shiloh after such a successful Lenten Teen Retreat this past March, so please be respectful of the guidelines set forth above, particularly the registration deadline of November 8th. Again, the Diocese must provide an initial headcount by that date—please do not delay. After that date I cannot guarantee participation.

I ask that you personally speak to your middle school and high school female parishioners, and their parents, in order to encourage attendance. If you have any questions about the retreat, please do not hesitate to contact me. I look forward to seeing both old and new faces at this event!

#### RETREAT DETAILS

The Annual Girls Retreat is scheduled for **November 22-24, 2019 at Camp Shiloh located at** 753 Burnt Meadow Road in Hewitt, NJ. There is **no charge** to participate in this three-day event. Participants may start arriving for check-in on Friday, November 22<sub>nd</sub> at 6:00pm. The weekend will officially kick-off around 8:00pm following dinner.

"Come as you are: A friend loves at all times!" is this year's retreat theme. We have a new set up this year: a panel of speakers who will discuss friendships. The weekend will be laid back and allow for plenty of free time, including hiking and other activities (weather permitting).

**Venue:** Camp Shiloh is a Christian Retreat Center in Northern New Jersey offering excellent accommodations, plenty of activities, a huge gymnasium, game room, and many opportunities to enjoy the great outdoors with hiking, campfires, etc.

**Sleeping arrangements and attire:** All members of the group will be staying in a dorm style building. **Participants and chaperones must bring a sleeping bag and pillow, as the venue does not supply bedding.** We will be traveling outdoors, so be sure to pack appropriate clothes and a jacket. Casual or athletic attire should be brought for daytime and outdoor activities, and church clothes for Sunday Liturgy. **See suggested packing list included in this packet.** 

Chaperones: We welcome parents and youth leaders to accompany the participants and act as chaperones. However, due to increased attendance at recent retreats and space limitations, we ask that parishes limit the number of adult chaperones accompanying your group to 1 adult. The number of chaperones over our past few events has overwhelmed our participants, so this needs to be addressed in such a manner. The number of chaperones for this retreat will be strictly aligned with the Diocesan Policy of having 1 chaperone for every 6 participants (ex: 25 participants, only 4 chaperones). Chaperones will be selected on a first come, first served basis. If you have any concerns regarding this, please bring it to Danielle Geeza and Fr. If any additional adults or clergy (non-chaperones) <u>arrive WITHOUT having registered with the</u> <u>intention of staying for the weekend OR only for a day, the venue WILL NOT allow this</u> as the Diocese must pay for all expenses prior to the event.

As a reminder, all chaperones must fill out the Chaperone Registration form/agreement.

**Duration of stay:** Participants are highly encouraged to stay the full weekend from Friday-Sunday in order to get the full experience. All parents and guardians are invited to Sunday's Divine Liturgy at 10am in the Fireside Meeting Room. Danielle Geeza will remain until the last participant is picked up.

How do I sign up? Registration forms must be filled out for each participant and chaperone no later than NOVEMBER 8th, after that date, we cannot quarantee your participation.
