

St. Andrew's Camp continues to offer youth camping programs and provide facilities for retreats, gatherings and events. Our mission is to bring people- young and old, closer to Christ through prayer and a full liturgical life, through fellowship and education and through their encounter with a simple natural and peaceful environment.

All the summer camp program planning and recruiting that had been accomplished until March was set aside. So we "sat back" and waited for the NY State Board of Health to make a decision, attended weekly Orthodox Camp Directors' Zoom Planning Meetings, and made a myriad of other plans, so many that were dropped because of the cost of putting Covid protocols in place.

A plan finally came to the surface: Virtual Camp! We designed a format and ran with it... but it was becoming apparent, that by late July families and children would be 'Zoomed Out", having had so much intense virtual interaction for 5 months, and internet instability was becoming a real concern. Virtual Camp was out. Back to the drawing board...and with still no decision from the State, we took a risk and went back to what we knew, but reformatted it into Family Campa way to stay within State Covid Guidelines, and have a smaller group that could social distance in our facilities. We designed a plan and ran with it...only to have the State, in late June, go against the American Camp Association recommendations and ban all Overnight Camp Programs. So we reformatted again, renamed it Family Retreat, and ran with it... We applied for a permit to run a Lodging/Restaurant/Waterfront which allowed us to run a retreat with families as retreaters, and abiding by social distancing, sanitizing protocols and designated/separated areas for each family.

A Covid protocol plan was created for each building, as well as the sports field, the waterfront, and plans

for outdoor dining, outdoor services, and outdoor classes so that we could lessen out time in masks, but

with a plan B for all these activities should we need to be indoors due to heavy rain or unhealthful hot

weather. A campus sanitizing schedule, new kitchen sanitizing protocol, and other duties were created to be executed by counselors now called staff.

Some highlights...

The Welcome Luau—an incredible meal and children Hawaiian dancing

Families be able to participate in the services and readings together. Fr. Jason Vansuch had made folders with each service ahead of time, so that they could bring their own booklets to church for each service.

Our closing campfires with smores and wonderful music filled fellowship.

Ending the retreat with the Akathist: "Glory to God for All Things!" as if it had been written specifically for us in the beautiful St. Andrew's camp setting.

This was a huge success and provided us with a template for similar future offerings in the future. Five parishes participated in the Family Week. Clergy participants included Fr. David Cowan, Fr. Jason Vansuch, Fr. Matthew Markewich, and Fr. John Malcom. Matushka Tamara Cowan planned and organized an excellent daily schedule of liturgical services, activities- horse stable visits, kayaking, swimming, and educational offerings, (a outline of our schedule is attached.)

Volunteers and staff included Matthew Just, Julia and Nathan Speen, Kristina Anastiadis, Stefan Johansen, Kaedon Campbell, Steven Roberts, Stefan Johanssen, Andrew Temple, and Matushka Jeanne Zablotsky We were of course blessed and grateful for Archbishop Michael's presence and continued support of the youth programs. His belief in the youth of the diocese and their continued nurturing in the Faith remains a beacon for the Board and Staff. Through the support of Board members and additional donors the cost of the Family program was kept at a very reasonable rate and we were able to cover all expenses including the additional sanitizing and regulatory supplies required.

We continue to raise funds for the new, much needed Dining Hall kitchen and multipurpose facility. Not only will this better serve our summer youth programs but it will expand our ability to offer a multipurpose facility year round for the Diocese and rentals. With donations and pledges we are about half way to our goal of \$300,000. During the pandemic the economic slowdown was reflected, as in all parishes, in a slowdown of donations, but we believe this will soon pick up to allow us to build the facility very soon!!

Volunteers are needed year round for painting, grounds work, light carpentry, cleaning and other maintenance and support.
