Your Eminence, Very Reverend and Reverend Fathers, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

At the Diocesan Assembly of 2021, our beloved Archbishop Michael gave the directive to "re-examine our Church School programs and parish youth organizations ... giving way to more personally involved methods of bringing Christ to our young people." The generous financial support of the Distinguished Diocesan Benefactors Program (DDB) has made this vision a reality with three training events: the Vacation Church School Workshops held in Syracuse (August 20), Yonkers (August 27), and Paramus (October 22).


Making memories makes a difference! Statistics show that kids who go to Christian camps, Vacation Church Schools (VCS), and similar experiential events, stay in church. The National Study of Youth and Religion has found that those who attend religious camp as teenagers or young children are significantly more likely in their young adult years to participate in shared religious activities, like group Bible studies, college religious groups and church attendance, than those who have never attended summer church camps or vacation church school programs. Indeed, those who attended religious summer camp as children were over three times more likely to remain religious five years later than those who did not attend. The key to children's programming is the excitement it brings and the memories it leaves with the youth. Children form a connection with their Orthodox peers and the church community, thus making lifelong friendships and relationships.

The Vacation Church School Workshops which you have sponsored teach parishes, youth workers, and clergy how to effectively plan an exciting event, which can be used throughout the year, to draw in youth and families who are not regularly coming to their parishes due to the lasting effects of the pandemic, or other events that compete for our Sunday attendance. As our VCS Workshop leader, Kelly Potteiger, has said, "It is truly a parish undertaking, of a quality program that not only teaches Orthodox theology, but also instills in the youth a lifetime commitment to a relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We are excited to announce that we are finally able to be trained in Level 2. CGS LEVEL 2 Formation Training (6-9 year old curriculum) will be held at St. Tikhon's Seminary in early June 2023.



All Diocesan members who desire to be trained will be sponsored by the DDB. At the same event, there will also be an opportunity to be trained in Level I to assist in an Atrium. This will allow us to expand our age levels in our existing Atriums and start more Atriums around the Diocese.
