## NEW YORK STATE DEANERY THE DIOCESE OF NEW YORK AND NEW JERSEY Report to the 2023 Diocesan Assembly

Your Eminence, brother clergy, and lay delegates and observers to the Diocesan Assembly: Glory be to Jesus Christ!

In a last 3 years, by an almost unprecedented display of governmental authority, church attendance has been severely curtailed. Authorities have directed that all gatherings be limited to fewer than 10. For 2 years, most of the Church worship services have ceased altogether. As pandemic eased over the course of the last 3 years, tremendous amount of work was devoted by His Eminence, Diocesan Council, Diocesan Legal Committee, Parish Priests and Parish Councils to restore our normal parish and Diocesan life.

During the last year, His Eminence Archbishop Michael, in all his visits to our Deanery parishes, missions and institutions, has powerfully called us rededicate ourselves to 'The Gospel Vision'. Too often, our vision of the Church is a "self-sustaining one", not too hot, not too cold, lukewarm, concerned more with externals than with what is contained in the heart of man. But the "business-as-usual' approach that this implies is inconsistent with the Gospel which calls for a fundamental, self-sacrificing, energetic (dynamic) vision – understanding what it means "to be all things to all men, so that some may be saved"

Vladyko also warned us, that even if we re-dedicate ourselves to the Gospel Vision of witness and ministry, there is a danger that sometime after the enthusiasm is rekindled, ardor will have faded, and we instead proceed as we have been, without making the necessary changes to our church life, to address our challenges and to fulfill Christ's commands to us.

It is crucial to uphold the proper teaching of Orthodox ecclesiology, that the sum total of the church exists within each local diocesan church and the unity of the local diocesan churches, expressed through the unity of their shepherds, create what is referred to as the "Territorial Church", and that the diocese contains within itself, complete and total catholicity: all that is necessary to be the church, and that reflects true and proper Orthodox ecclesiology concerning the nature and prerogatives of the diocesan church. It is all of our responsibility (both clergy and laity) to re-dedicate ourselves to the Gospel Vision of witness and ministry, and to uphold the proper teaching of Orthodox ecclesiology.

Currently, every parish, mission and institution in the New York State Deanery is being served by full-time priest or covered on a short and long-term basis, when emergencies arise. While being able to fill all the pastoral needs of New York State Deanery with the help of attached priests and deacons, we must continue our efforts to recruit younger priests aggressively from seminaries, other dioceses, and jurisdictions.

Our Deanery clergy and lay representatives participated monthly in a meeting of Diocesan Council, assisting His Eminence in implementing his vision for our diocese, as well as meetings of Council of Presbyters, Diocesan Court, and meetings of the Chancellors and Deans with Archbishop Michael, to facilitate clergy transfers, filling vacancies, and resolving other administrative, canonical, and legal issues. In spite of challenges of great geographic distances of our parishes, the deanery continues to be very active and focused on the growth of parishes and missions through ministries, outreach, education and evangelization.

- Annual Deanery Lenten Clergy Retreat with Archbishop Michael in Syracuse
- Annual Diocesan Youth Day

• Youth and clergy from NY State Deanery parishes and missions were actively involved in St. Andrew's Summer Camp (during July and first week of August), as camp directors, counselors, and campers; especially from Elmira, Rochester, Herkimer, Endicott, Lansing, Buffalo, and few others, in substantial numbers
