A canon of supplication to the Most-holy Theotokos,
sung in every spiritual affliction and circumstance by Theocteristus the Monk

About this service

This Service of Supplication, which is also known as Paraklesis or Molieben, is one offered especially during times of spiritual distress, sickness, temptation, or discouragement. The various prayers ask our Lord Jesus Christ for guidance, personal strength, and healing.

Many of the hymns and prayers are directed toward Mary, the Mother of our Lord, asking for her assistance and intercession before the Savior. The Orthodox Church holds a special place for Mary the mother of God. The early Church gave her the title “the Theotokos” (Greek for “birthgiver of God”) to profess the reality of God’s love by having His Son take on humanity in every way possible – except sin – yet still remaining God. Mary was chosen by God because she had dedicated her entire life to God, and was able to say “yes” to His will.

Orthodox Christianity affirms that each of us along with the Virgin Mary, the Saints, and the faithful departed is united in a bond of faith and love in Christ. Therefore, just as in this life we can turn to each other for prayer, the Church believes that we can also turn to Mary – the human being closest to God – and ask her to pray to God for us.

We frequently pray to the Theotokos as an intercessor before Her Son in our times of distress and need. Our Orthodox Faith is a faith “in communion” with one another, the Saints, and the Mother of our Lord. Our Lord said that “where two or three are gathered in my Name, I am there in their midst.” Our Lord calls us to gather in His Name, in order to bear each other’s burdens and share the grief of others as Christians, offering consolation and support.

Today, we are praying for Mary's intercession on behalf of those struggling with an unplanned pregnancy, pregnancy loss, infertility, post abortion recovery, and sexual trauma or abuse because of the honored role Mary played in Christ's earthly life. She gave birth to Him, nursed Him, fed Him, and all those other tasks a loving mother would do. She was in Cana at our Lord' first miracle, when she interceded on behalf of the newly married couple and guests when they were in need. Mary journeyed with Jesus, supporting His ministry along with His disciples, and she was found at the foot of the cross when our Lord was crucified.

The Priest proceeds to the center of the Temple.
